Old Testament Lesson: Genesis 2:18-24 Maureen Pickett


^{2:18} Then the LORD God said, 'It is not good that the human should be alone; I will make a partner.' ¹⁹ So out of the ground the LORD God formed every animal of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to the human to see what name they would receive; and whatever the human called each living creature, that was its name. ²⁰ The human gave names to all cattle, and to the birds of the air, and to every animal of the field; but for the human there was not found a partner. ²¹ So the LORD God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the human, and the human slept; then the Holy One took one of the human's ribs

and closed up its place with flesh. ²² And the rib that the LORD God had taken from the human the Holy One made into a partner and brought her to the human. ²³ Then the human said,

'This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; this one, too, shall be called Human, for out of Human this one was taken.'

²⁴ Therefore humans leave their parents and cling to their partners, and they become one flesh.

Gospel Lesson: Mark 10:2-16 Maureen Pickett

^{10:2} Some Pharisees came, and to test him they asked, 'Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife?' ³ He answered them, 'What did Moses command you?' ⁴ They said, 'Moses allowed a man to write a certificate of dismissal and to divorce her.' ⁵ But Jesus said to them, 'Because of your hardness of heart he wrote this commandment for you. ⁶ But from the beginning of creation, "God made them as humans." ⁷ "For this reason they shall leave their parents and be joined together, ⁸ and the two shall become one flesh." So they are no longer two, but one flesh. ⁹ Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate.'

¹⁰ Then in the house the disciples asked him again about this matter. ¹¹⁻¹² He said to them, 'Whoever divorces one and marries another commits adultery.'

¹³ People were bringing little children to him in order that he might touch them; and the disciples spoke sternly to them. ¹⁴ But when Jesus saw this, he was indignant and said to them, 'Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. ¹⁵ Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it.' ¹⁶ And he took them up in his arms, laid his hands on them, and blessed them.
